

# **OUR SPEAKER**

Katherine is an applied sociologist and qualitative methodologist who works with the health sector to examine and transform how health services are experienced and delivered. She uses participatory, qualitative, and visual research methodologies with participants, health research professionals. patients, and care-givers. Her particular areas of interest include the sociology of reproduction and motherhood, perinatal medicine, and lactation sciences. Prior to her appointment at the ANU, she held a position as Assistant Professor in the Mayo Clinic Medical School in the USA (2014-2016) where she established a Qualitative Research Services team to undertake qualitative and sociological research in and with medicine.

Katherine has helped pioneer the Video Reflexive Ethnography (VRE) methodology in Australian and American hospitals. She has worked in collaborative research partnerships with health professionals in the high-technology, ethically charged spaces of the neonatal intensive care unit, adult intensive care, surgery, surgical pathology, and the emergency department. She has published extensively on the methodology, including two co-authored books, Visualising Health Care Practice Improvement (2013, Radcliffe) and Video-Reflexive Ethnography in Health Research and Healthcare Improvement: Theory and Application (2019, Taylor and Francis).
